## **Sneaker Class:**

Each student will be making a pair of sneakers from start to finish and ready to wear. We'll be making a sandwich which will be for the outer and tongue portions of the sneakers. Then adding a binding, eyelets as well as the soles and last but not lease the shoe laces. I know this sounds easy but it will take time for each of these steps, you may think I can't do this but you can. They will have a one-of-a-kind pair of sneakers when finished. They will love it when someone says "Oh I love your sneakers, where did you get them? You reply thanks, I made them."

This class will take 12 hours, the 1<sup>st</sup> day to prepare the fabric for the construction of the sneakers. The 2<sup>nd</sup> day they finish preparing the fabric, punching the holes, adding the eyelets and binding, the last step is sewing the soles to the uppers.

. Each student will be paying \$65.00 up front for the soles in the size they need, as well as the other supplies that will be needed to complete the sneakers. These supplies need to be purchased at least 6 weeks in.

## Supply list:

- Sewing machine in good working order.
- 2-fat quarts contrasting outside and inside for your sneakers.
- 1-15" square of fabric for the binding (this should be of solid colors coordinate with your outer fat quart.)
- Thread matching or contrasting to the fat quilters and a matching thread to your binding.

- Marking tools that will show on all the fabric (these marks will not show, so a marker or whatever that you will be able to see)
- Large and medium wonder clips.
- Double sided fusible IN-R-FOAM (18X22). Found on Amazon or JoAnn's
- Single sided Fashion Fuse woven interfacing(18X22). Found same as above.
- Metal Stiletto.
- Pins.
- Seam ripper
- Sharp Scissors both paper and fabric.
- Ruler 6 X 24 or longer.
- Shoe laces, 42 to 45 inches for low tops.
- Shoe laces, 56 to 60 inches for the high tops.

If you have a leather hole punch (we have a number of holes to punch we need both the 2mm and 4mm sizes. I have some so we will be tokening turns with them. While some are using the punches other will be doing the sewing that needs to be done.)
